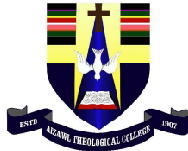

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I. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The Aizawl Theological College seeks to nurture spiritually grounded, intellectually responsible, academically competent, and ministerially effective servants of Christ for the Church and society. In keeping with its motto, **“Service to God and Humankind,”** and in accordance with the academic standards of the Senate of Serampore College, the College aims to prepare men and women for various forms of Christian ministry, especially within the Mizo churches and in broader ecclesial, social, and multicultural contexts.

The College therefore seeks to:

1. Deepen Christian faith and discipleship by strengthening students’ personal commitment to Christ, nurturing spiritual maturity, and enabling them to discern God’s will and calling for their lives.
2. Provide sound biblical and theological knowledge through the study of Scripture, Christian doctrine, biblical interpretation, practical theology, missiology, church history, and the disciplines of Christian life and ministry.
3. Cultivate critical and contextual theological reflection so that students are equipped to engage contemporary issues, ethical challenges, prophetic concerns, and the social implications of the Christian faith with intellectual responsibility and pastoral sensitivity.
4. Equip students for effective ministry by helping them discern and develop their ministerial gifts, vocational calling, leadership abilities, and practical skills for service as pastors, missionaries, teachers, counsellors, and other forms of Christian ministry.

5. Promote academic excellence and ministerial integrity by integrating rigorous theological study with spiritual formation, ecclesial commitment, and responsible engagement with the Church and society.
6. Prepare students for mission in a pluralistic world by developing an awareness of major world religions, cultural traditions, contemporary social trends, and the challenges of ministry in multicultural and multi-religious contexts.
7. Contribute to the edification of the Church and society through the formation of ordained and lay leaders, theological education, pastoral service, mission engagement, and other ministries that embody faithful service to God, humankind and the rest of the creation.

II. HISTORY

Aizawl Theological College traces its origins to 1907, when Welsh Calvinistic Methodist missionaries, later known as the Welsh Presbyterian Mission, established a small theological school in Aizawl to train Mizo Christians for evangelism, pastoral ministry, and the wider service of the Church. The initiative was led by Rev. D.E.Jones, popularly known among the Mizos as Pu Zosaphluia, a pioneer missionary of the Presbyterian Church of Wales. In its early stage, the school was strengthened by trained Mizo pastors such as Rev. Chhuahkhama, Rev. Liangkhaia and Rev. Saiaithanga, whose contributions were instrumental in the development of theological education among the Mizos.

In 1924, the school was relocated from Aizawl to Durtlang, on the present site of the Synod Hospital, under the care of Rev. F.J.Sandy and several Mizo teachers. Following Rev.

Sandy's sudden death, the school returned to Aizawl in 1927 under the supervision of Rev. E.L.Mendus. Owing to financial constraints and other historical circumstances, the school was temporarily closed in 1937. However, after the Second World War and India's Independence, the need for theological education became increasingly evident. In 1951, the Assembly of the Mizoram Presbyterian Church resolved to reopen the institution, with Rev. J.M. Lloyd as its Principal.

After acquiring the site at Mission Vengthlang, Aizawl, the College was formally established on the site in 1964. In the following year, 1965, it was granted affiliation by the Senate of Serampore College at the Licentiate in Theology (L.Th) level, with Mizo as the medium of instruction. Rev. J.M. Lloyd was succeeded by Rev. C. Pazawna, the first Mizo Principal of the College. His long tenure marked an important period of academic consolidation and institutional growth. In 1971, the College was upgraded to the Bachelor of Theology (B.Th) level by the Senate of Serampore College, and English became the medium of instruction for the degree programme. These developments coincided with a significant period in Mizoram's political history, as the region became a Union Territory in 1972 and later a full-fledged State in 1987.

During the 1970s and 1980s, the College continued to strengthen its B.Th programme, lay theological education, and missionary training. In 1983, the Mizoram Presbyterian Church Synod resolved to upgrade the College to the Bachelor of Divinity (B.D.) level in response to the growing ministerial, missionary, and theological needs of the Church. Since the Mission Vengthlang campus could no longer accommodate further expansion, a new 21.6-acres site was acquired at Durtlang Leitan, north of Aizawl. Preparations for the new campus progressed with the support of the Synod, local

congregations and well-wishers. The Gospel Centenary Building, now the College's main academic building, was inaugurated by former Principal Rev. J.M. Lloyd on 11th January 1994 during the Gospel Centenary year in Mizoram.

In 1994, the Senate of Serampore College granted ATC provisional affiliation to offer the B.D. programme. The B.D. Orientation Course began in October 1994 with 26 students, marking a new phase in the academic development of the College. In June 1998, the Academic Council of the Senate of Serampore College granted the College full affiliation as a BD institution. The B.Th. programme was subsequently phased out in 2003, making B.D. programme ATC's principal programme for ministerial formation.

The College later expanded its academic mission by introducing postgraduate and doctoral theological education. The Master of Theology (M.Th) programme was introduced in stages: Christian Theology in 2002; New Testament and Missiology in 2007; History of Christianity in 2009; Old Testament and Religions in 2011; and Pastoral Counselling in 2018. The Doctor of Theology (D.Th) programme was inaugurated in Christian Theology in 2013, followed by New Testament and Missiology in 2014. In 2022, the programme was further expanded to include Old Testament, Christian Ministry (with specialization in Counselling), and History of Christianity.

In addition to its residential programmes, the College serves as a recognized local centre of the Senate of Serampore College for the Bachelor of Christian Studies (B.C.S.), Diploma in Christian Studies (Dip.C.S), and Doctor of Ministry (D.Min) programmes. The BCS and Dip.CS programmes are offered in both Mizo and English.

Throughout its history, the College has continued to grow in its academic programmes, institutional life, and service to the Church. Today, Aizawl Theological College stands as one of the leading ecumenical theological institutions in Northeast India. Although founded, sustained, and governed by the Mizoram Presbyterian Church through the Synod Theological Education Board, it serves men and women from various Protestant churches across Mizoram, Northeast India, other parts of India and the neighbouring regions. Its continuing mission is to form theologically mature, spiritually grounded, and ministerially competent servants of Christ for the Church, theological education, mission, counselling, and society.

VIII. ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

A. RESIDENTIAL COURSE

1. Bachelor of Divinity (B.D):

The Bachelor of Divinity (B.D.) is a three-year residential degree programme. Although designated as a bachelor's degree, it is academically equivalent to a master's level programme and is intended for candidates who have already completed an undergraduate degree. Students at the B.D. level are introduced to the foundations of theology as well as advanced theological studies at a later stage.

Graduates with a B.Th or B.Miss. degree who have successfully completed all the required subjects are eligible for admission directly into the second year of the B.D. programme. Additionally, applicants who have not previously completed Preliminary Greek and Preliminary Hebrew shall be required to pass these subjects as compulsory College-examined papers. Graduates from institutions accredited by the **Asia Theological Association (ATA)** are required to pass the **B.D. Qualifying Examination** of the Senate of Serampore College before admission to the B.D. programme.

Candidates selected for the B.D. programme will attend the **Orientation Course** from October- April.

2. Master of Theology (M.Th):

The minimum duration of the Master of Theology (M.Th.) programme is two academic years. Candidates who meet the requirements of the Senate of Serampore College are eligible to undertake M.Th studies. The College currently offers M.Th. programmes in seven departments - Old Testament, New

Testament, Christian Theology, History of Christianity, Missiology, Religions and Counselling.

3. Doctor of Theology (D.Th.):

The Doctor of Theology (D.Th.) is a minimum three-year residential programme. Candidates holding a Senate of Serampore M.Th. degree with a minimum of Grade B, or its equivalent, are eligible to undertake this programme. The College currently offers D.Th. programme in six departments - Old Testament, New Testament, Christian Theology, History of Christianity, Missiology and Counselling.

B. NON-RESIDENTIAL COURSE

1. Diploma in Christian Studies (Dip.C.S.):

Candidates seeking admission to the Diploma in Christian Studies (Dip.C.S.) must pass 10+2 or an equivalent qualification. Candidates may choose either English or Mizo medium of instruction. The minimum duration of the programme is two years.

2. Bachelor of Christian Studies (B.C.S.):

Candidates seeking admission to the Bachelor of Christian Studies (B.C.S.) shall hold a B.Th., B.A., or an equivalent qualification. Those who have passed the Mature Candidates' Entrance Examination are also eligible to apply. Candidates may choose either English or Mizo medium of instruction. The minimum duration of the course is four years.

Every academic year the College organizes contact seminars for Dip.C.S. and B.C.S. students.

3. Doctor of Ministry (DMin):

Aizawl Theological College is one of the examination centres for the Doctor of Ministry (D.Min.) programme of the Senate of Serampore College.

C. OTHER ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES:

1. Lay Theological Education (LTE) is an ongoing programme of the College through which the Mobile Theological School and Bible Correspondence programmes are conducted.
2. Church Music is another important course offered by the College.
3. The Calvin Study Centre (C.S.C.) is an integral part of the College. The Centre organises seminars and provides research facilities on the life, thought, and theological tradition of John Calvin.

IX. ACADEMIC SESSION

The College follows semester system for B.D. and M.Th. programmes. The First Semester begins in June and ends in September. The Second Semester begins in October and ends in April. Examinations are conducted at the end of each Semester.

XI. FIELD EDUCATION

Field Education programme is an integral part of theological education offered in ATC. The College follows the guidelines of the Senate of Serampore College in organizing the Field Education programme. Field Education Manual is prepared to suit the particular needs of the Church and community in Mizoram. BD students are expected to regularly attend Field Education programme without which they will not be awarded their degrees. M.Th II students, who finished their BD studies in other theological colleges, and who are members of the Mizoram Presbyterian Church are also given special assignment of Church visits on Sunday so as to orient them to the life and ministry of their own local Church community.

There are two types of Field Education programme – concurrent and intensive. Concurrent Field Education programme includes regular Sunday church visit, attending Presbytery meetings and practical exposure in relation to some of the courses of study, such as visit to hospice and religious places of different religions. Intensive Field Education includes the programmes conducted during semester break and winter

vacation, such as working with NGOs, mission field exposure, rural and urban exposure.

XII. ADMISSION AND REGISTRATION

1. General Requirements:

- 1) The applicant must be a full communicant member and is in good standing with his/her church with a commitment to discipleship.
- 2) The applicant must have a definite call to God's service.
- 3) The applicant must be able to conduct his/her studies in English.

2. Application:

Online application for the different courses has to be done through the College website: www.atc.edu.in

3. Entrance Test and Interview:

1. Bachelor of Divinity (BD):

- (1) Candidates have to submit their application form together with the required documents within the stipulated period.
- (2) The College conducts entrance examination in the following subjects:

(a) English	100 marks
(b) Bible Knowledge	50 marks
(c) General Knowledge	50 marks
- (3) Candidates holding a B.Th. degree shall be exempted from the Bible Knowledge examination.

- (4) Candidates selected by the Faculty through the entrance examination are interviewed by the Theological Education Board (TEB) for final selection.
- (5) A candidate whose sibling is enrolled in any residential programme in the College shall not be eligible for admission.

2. Master of Theology (MTh):

- (1) Candidates have to submit their application form together with the required documents within the stipulated period.
- (2) The College shall conduct entrance examination in the following:
 - (a) English 100 marks
 - (b) Departmental test (written) 100 marks
 - (c) Departmental interview
- (3) Candidates selected by the Faculty through the entrance examination are interviewed by the TEB for final selection.
- (4) A candidate whose sibling is enrolled in any residential programme in the College shall not be eligible for admission.

3. Doctor of Theology (DTh):

- (1) Candidates have to submit their application form together with the required documents within the stipulated period.
- (2) D.Th applicants have to pass the Common Entrance Test (CET) and attend the Research Methodology Course organized by the Department of SATHRI, Senate of Serampore College

- (3) The College shall conduct a departmental interview.
- (4) Candidates selected by the Faculty will be interviewed by the TEB for final selection.

XIII. FACILITIES

1. Library & Archives

ATC Library has extensive collection of books, journals, dictionaries and commentaries. The library has access to e-libraries for students and researchers. It also has mutual understanding with libraries of other institutions, such as Mizoram University, which provide wider access for gathering study/research materials for the students. The Archives contain rare and valuable documents which are intensively utilized by students and researchers, not only from ATC, but also by scholars and researchers from other theological colleges and from secular fields.

2. Chapel

During the academic session morning devotion is conducted in the Chapel from 9:00 a.m. to 9:20 a.m. from Monday to Friday. The morning devotions are primarily meant for students and faculty members, except Thursday morning when the non-teaching staff join the devotion. Sunday evening is set aside for ATC Community Worship Service for all the community members. Visitors are always welcomed to join the services organized in the Chapel throughout the week. The Chapel is also kept open for those who want to have private devotion/reflection and prayer during daytime and in the evening.

3. Book Service

The Book Service purchase books and other reading materials from different publishers in India and abroad which

the students and the faculty members need for academic purposes.

The Bookshop is run by students i/c Book Service under the guidance of one of the Faculty members, who is appointed as the Manager/Secretary of Book Service Committee. It is opened in the afternoon of Monday, Wednesday and Friday from 02:00 pm – 04:30 pm/ 03:30 pm – 04:30 pm.

4. General Store

The General Store is located right next to the main gate. Students and community members can purchase their daily household and academic needs from the General Store from Monday to Saturday.

5. Canteen

Food, tea and snacks are available for purchase in the College Canteen for students, faculty, office staff, community members and visitors from Monday to Friday.

6. Biblical Garden

The Biblical Garden provides ecological beauty and peace and it is a place for rest, prayer and contemplation. Prayer Mount and Zoram Galilee are located inside the Biblical Garden. Zoram Galilee is modelled after the Lake of Galilee in Palestine and it is one of the main attractions for visitors where they can visualize the ministry of Jesus in and around Galilee.

7. House of Prayer

At the top of the Biblical Garden, there is a 'House of Prayer' called *Beth-Tepilah* in Hebrew. Here the college community members and visitors from within and outside Mizoram engage in devotion and meditation, and gain spiritual nourishment.

8. Museum and Art Gallery

The College is developing a museum, housing articles of historic and cultural interest.

XIV. COLLEGE PRIZE

The College encourages the students to have a healthy competition in their academic performance and in their relationships with one another. To promote such kind of environment the following academic prizes are offered:

A. B.D. PRIZE:

1. GENERAL:

- 1) Proficiency Prize:** Awarded annually to student/s who secured a minimum average of 70% marks in the examinations of the previous academic year.
- 2) Upa Kapbuanga Memorial Prize for Bible Knowledge:** Awarded to student/s who secure the highest three marks in the annual Bible Knowledge Examination.
- 3) C.L. Thansanga Prize:** Awarded to student/s securing the highest marks in the special college paper “Life and Thought of John Calvin”.
- 4) Gospel Centenary Prize:** Awarded to student who secured the highest aggregate marks in the whole course of studies.
- 5) Dr. C. Biakmawia Prize:** Awarded to the best out-going student selected by the Faculty on the basis of his/ her all round performance.

- 6) **R.L. Laltawnga Prize:** Awarded to student/s securing the highest marks in Inter- Disciplinary Course.

XVI. SPONSORSHIP

Synod sponsorship is the official approval and recommendation granted by the Synod Theological Education Board (TEB) to students who are undertaking different levels of theological studies.

I. Types of Synod Sponsorship

- 1) Deputational Sponsorship: Granted to permanent Synod workers who are officially deputed to undertake theological studies.
- 2) Sponsorship with Financial Support: Granted to candidates, other than deputed Synod workers, who are undertaking theological studies at colleges or seminaries affiliated to the Senate of Serampore College.
- 3) Sponsorship without Financial Support: Granted to candidates pursuing theological studies without financial support from the Synod. Permanent Synod workers, who wish to undertake theological studies at their own expense may also apply for this category of sponsorship.

II. Categories of Sponsorship

- 1) Deputational Financial Support: Permanent Synod workers who are deputed by the Synod shall be entitled to receive their salaries and other financial assistance in accordance with the Synod Service Rules.
- 2) Maximum Scholarship (Category I): This scholarship shall cover all college and Senate fees. Married students residing in family quarters shall pay their electricity, water, and waste management expenses at their own expenses.

- 3) Medium Scholarship (Category II): This scholarship shall cover college fees, such as registration, tuition, examination, sports, magazine and association, hostel fees excluding mess fee. Married students residing in family quarters shall pay their electricity, water, and waste management expenses at their own expenses.
- 4) Minimum Scholarship (Category III): This scholarship shall cover all compulsory college fees excluding Mess fee and Senate fee. It is applicable only to single students who are staying in the hostel.

III. Conditions for Sponsorship

1. Financial support for deputed Synod workers shall be awarded by the TEB after considering the candidates' academic records, character, and the needs of the Church.
2. The various categories of scholarship shall be awarded at the discretion of the TEB.
3. For the continuation of any scholarship in subsequent years of study, scholarship recipients shall maintain at least a Grade B average, and the confidential reports received from their respective colleges shall be satisfactory.
4. Synod sponsorship and financial support granted to any candidate may be withdrawn at any time during the course of studies if the candidate fails to comply with the standards and directives of the TEB.
5. Candidates who have not been granted Synod sponsorship for a particular course of study may apply for Synod sponsorship for another course of theological study.

Applicants seeking Synod scholarships must declare whether they are receiving any other financial sponsorship.

6. Students who have completed one year or more of a particular course of study without financial support from the Synod will not be entertained for Synod financial support. However, special consideration can be made by the TEB in extraordinary cases.
7. Candidates receiving minimum or medium scholarship may apply to the TEB for a higher category of scholarship after completing one year or more of theological studies. Applicants shall provide sufficient justification for their request. The TEB, after due consideration, may approve or decline the application.

XVII. CAMPUS LIFE

1. All students residing on the College campus shall abide by the Hostel Rules and Directives.
2. Maintenance of Hostel:
 - (1) Rooms:
 - (a) The College provides suitable hostel accommodation for its students. Each student is provided with a bed, a table, a chair, a bookshelf and a wardrobe.
 - (b) Students have to bring their own mattresses, quilts, mosquito nets, flashlight, glass tumblers or cups, teaspoons, water jugs, buckets, mugs and light tools for social work.
3. The Common Room:
 - (a) The Common Room is meant to be a fellowship cum recreation room.

- (b) The Common Room is equipped with newspapers and television, which shall be used responsibly.

4. The Campus and College Property:

- (1) Students are expected to be stewards of the College campus. They can use College properties responsibly and keep it clean and in good condition.
- (2) Generator facilities shall be made available for Chapel services, the Library, hostels and any other College programmes during power outages.

5. The Dining Hall:

(1) The Mess:

- (a) All students shall participate in mess management on a rotational basis. The SB Committee appoint one Mess Manager and the mess team for each month while the College is in session.

(2) Guidelines for Dining:

- (a) Tea and meal time: Separate tea and meal times are observed during the Summer and Winter. The Summer season extends from March to October, while the Winter season extends from November to February, as follows:

Summer : 5:30 a.m.

Winter : 6:00 a.m.

Morning Meal

Summer & Winter : 8:00 a.m.

Noon Tea

Summer & Winter : 12:15-12:55 p.m.

Afternoon Tea

Summer : 5:30 p.m.

Winter : 5:00 p.m.

6. Time for Private Devotion & Worship:

- (1) All the students are expected to follow the timings given below:

Rising Bell : 5:30 a.m (Summer)

6:00 a.m (Winter)

Private Devotion : 5:45 - 6:15 a.m. (Summer)

6:15 - 6:45 a.m. (Winter)

Morning Corporate Worship : 9:00 - 9:20 a.m

SB/SCM Evening Worship : 6:30 - 7:00 p.m. (Summer)

6:00 - 6:30 p.m. (Winter)

- (2) Since worship is an indispensable element of theological training students are required to spend time in private devotions and regularly attend worship services in the College or elsewhere as directed by the College authorities. Students who are unable to do so have to obtain prior permission from the concerned College authorities.

- (3) SCMI services are held on Tuesday evenings and the SB services are held on Wednesday and Friday evenings.

- (4) Students are expected to attend Sunday Evening Community Worship Service.

7. Study Time:

- (1) The following are the minimum hours for study prescribed by the College from Mondays to Fridays:

Morning : Summer 6:15 - 7:45 a.m.

Winter 6:45 - 7:45 a.m.

Evening : Summer 7:30 - 11:00 p.m.
Winter 7:00 - 10:30 p.m.

- (2) Evening study hours shall also be observed on Saturdays.
 - (3) Students are expected to remain in their respective rooms during study hours. The use of the Library for study during these hours may be permitted.
 - (4) Students have to maintain silence during study hours. The lifestyle and conduct must not in any way cause inconvenience or disturbance to fellow hostellers.
 - (5) Students can use headphones whenever necessary and shall avoid disturbing others during study hours.
 - (6) Students conducting Fellowship/Tutorial Group meetings during study hours have to inform the Hostel Superintendent in advance.
 - (7) As far as possible, committee meetings, choir practices, etc., shall not be held during study hours. Where it is absolutely necessary to hold such meetings, prior permission shall be obtained from the Hostel Superintendent.
 - (8) Students leaving the campus for Saturday outings are expected to return to campus by:
Summer : 6:30 pm
Winter : 6:00 pm.
8. Sports and Recreation Time:
- (1) Students are expected to observe the following timings for leisure and for playing outdoor and indoor games from Monday to Friday:-

3:15 p.m. - 5:10 p.m. (Summer)

3:15 p.m. - 4:40 p.m. (Winter)

- (2) Students may listen to the radio or view television in the Common Room during the time allotted for leisure and recreation.
- (3) On Saturdays, students may use the radio/TV during the day until the commencement of evening study hours.
- (4) Musical instruments can be played in the hostel during recreation time.

9. Visitors' Inn:

Visitors are to be entertained only in the Visitors' Inn.

10. Guests:

- (1) Student guests may be accommodated in the ICC guest room.
- (2) They shall pay the prescribed ICC guest room charges.
- (3) They may join the hostel mess by paying Rs. 150 per day, which includes morning meal, lunch, and evening meal.

11. Tutorial Groups

In every academic year students are divided into different Tutorial Groups under the leadership of the faculty members. The faculty member of each group is the Tutor for the students under his/her care. The main purpose of Tutorial Groups is to provide opportunity for fostering closer relationship between the faculty members and the students. Students can share their spiritual, personal and academic problems and concerns with their respective Tutors.

XVIII Publication

1. Didakhe Journal:

The College is publishing a bi-monthly theological journal in Mizo called *Didakhe* since 1972. It is an important channel where theological discussions on relevant contemporary issues are addressed.

2. Presbyterian Review:

The Presbyterian Review is an English quarterly, which the College published on behalf of the Mizoram Presbyterian Church. The Review contains news, reports and reflections about the Church, its mission and ministries.

3. Mizoram Journal of Theology:

Mizoram Journal of Theology, a theological journal in English, is also published bi-annually since 1999.

4. College Magazine:

The College Magazine is another annual publication. It normally contains English and Mizo articles.

5. The Mizo Theological Literature Committee (MTLC):

MTLC is affiliated to the Board for Theological Text Book Programmes for South Asia (BTTBPSA). It is responsible for the publication of theological textbooks and other useful reference books in Mizo. Most of these publications have undergone several reprints. The members of the Committee are drawn from all over Mizoram and the permanent Office Bearers are: Moderator, Mizoram Presbyterian Church Synod (Chairman), Principal, ATC (Secretary), Registrar, ATC (Treasurer), Dean of Post Graduate Studies, ATC (Manager).
